CHAPERONE ACTIVITIES

AGE/GRADE APPROPRIATENESS

Since we opened our first camp in 1982, we have gathered a wealth of experience developing and providing curriculum that is age and grade specific.

SPACE CAMP Huntsville, Alabama

U.S. SPACE CAMP opened its first facility in Huntsville, Ala., in 1982.

The Huntsville facility is an entity of the U.S. Space & Rocket Center® (USSRC), which was established by the State of Alabama. The USSRC and U.S. SPACE CAMP are primarily self sufficient with added support from corporate partners.

The USSRC is the official NASA Visitor Center for the Marshall Space Flight Center (MSFC) and receives no direct federal funding for operational support. NASA/MSFC does, however, supply technical assistance and expertise and is a contributor to programs for educators.

AVIATION CHALLENGE Huntsville, Alabama

The AVIATION CHALLENGE program began operation in June 1990.

The Huntsville facility is an entity of the U.S. Space & Rocket Center (USSRC), which was established by the State of Alabama. The USSRC and AVIATION CHALLENGE do not receive federal or military funding for operational support.

AVIATION CHALLENGE does receive in-kind technical support from the Armed Services.




SPACE CAMP Moffett Field in Silicon Valley, Mountain View, California

U.S. SPACE CAMP California began operation in July 1996 at NASA's Ames Research Center – heart of development and planning for future U.S. space exploration projects.

The California facility is centrally located in the world famous Silicon Valley, near the international airport in San Jose.

SPACE CAMP California is funded by the U.S. SPACE CAMP Foundation — a private, non-profit, taxexempt organization —and receives no direct federal funding for operational support. The camp does receive technical assistance and expertise from NASA-Ames as a contributor to on-site educational programs.



AVIATION CHALLENGE Atwater, California

AVIATION CHALLENGE California began operation in June 1997 at the former Castle Air Force Base.

The California facility is funded by the U.S. SPACE CAMP Foundation, a private, non-profit, taxexempt organization.



SPACE CAMP Titusville, Florida

U.S. SPACE CAMP Florida opened in April 1988 and is operated jointly by the U.S. Space Camp Foundation — a private, non-profit, tax-exempt organization — and the Astronaut Scholarship Foundation.

The SPACE CAMP Florida Training Center is located near NASA's Kennedy Space Center and shares a complex with the U.S. Astronaut Hall of Fame®.

SPACE CAMP Florida is funded by the U.S. SPACE CAMP Foundation and receives no direct federal funding for operational support.



COUNSELOR QUALIFICATIONS & TRAINING

You are entrusting us with the security and well-being of your child. Our rigid standards for hiring qualified counselors, as well as training them, have been established to ensure that your child enjoys a safe, fun and educational experience while attending our programs.

A minimum of two years of college or equivalent experience is mandatory for all counselors. While a significant percentage of our staff are education majors, others are pursuing degrees in business, science, math or the liberal arts. The common thread they all share is that they want to work with children. Many staff members have actually gone through the camp programs as trainees.

Every potential counselor must pass a comprehensive background check, preemployment attitude test and drug screening prior to employment. Once employed, and before they ever meet a trainee, all program staff members receive training in the following areas: program facts and history; simulator safety and operation; proper discipline techniques as outlined by the American Camping Association; and age-specific behavioral characteristics.

All counselors are closely supervised and are evaluated weekly at the end of each camp session by their team members. We encourage parents to meet program staff members at registration and graduation.

SAFETY & MEDICAL

Security

Camp supervisory staff and a separate security staff are on site or on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week when camp is in session to ensure the safety of your child. At no time are trainees allowed off-site individually or as a group without an accompanying adult. Off-site trips are limited to those included in the program curriculum.

Safety

The safety of all trainees is of utmost importance. Counselors are highly trained and certified in the proper use of all simulators so that trainees may have a safe, enjoyable experience.*

Each simulator is built to the highest standards and all equipment is safety checked and maintained by professional technicians. Each enclosed simulator is equipped with smoke detectors. It is mandatory that trainees wear safety helmets when using most of the astronaut training equipment.

A minimum height of four feet is required for the simulators used in the program curriculum. Maximum weight for astronaut training simulators is 260 pounds per person.

*Some of the space flight simulators may cause motion sickness.

Medical Staffing

Medical staff is on-site 24 hours daily in Alabama. Medical staff is on-site from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. in California and Florida, and onsite or on-call the remaining eight hours while camp is in session.

All medications (prescription, overthe-counter, vitamins, herbal) are collected during registration and dispensed as directed by you or the prescribing physician.

They must be in their original

containers with labels and instructions in English. Trainees requiring injections must provide medications; syringes; and legible, signed instructions from your physician.

Any medically related questions may be directed to the nursing staff at the camp in which you are interested. Refer to camp phone listings on page 32.

Special Needs Accommodations

Every effort is made to accommodate individuals with special needs — including those who are hearing or visually impaired, those with special dietary requirements, or individuals in wheelchairs.



HOUSING

SPACE CAMP Alabama

Trainees are housed in the Space Habitat, a futuristic space station mock-up, in individual rooms of up to seven persons or bays of 20-40 beds. The Habitat complex accommodates 800 people at full capacity, so a certain amount of noise is to be expected.

• Bed sheets and blanket, pillow and pillowcase, towels and





washcloths are provided. Bring a beach towel for water activities. Each trainee will have an assigned locker. Please bring your own lock.

 Restrooms are located throughout the complex with access to sinks, private shower stalls and private toilets.

AVIATION CHALLENGE Alabama

The AVIATION CHALLENGE Hangar houses up to 30 trainees in military-style bays. Counselors are housed with trainees in each bay.



- Bed sheets and blanket, pillow and pillowcase, towels and washcloths are provided. Bring a beach towel for water activities.
 Each trainee will have an assigned locker. Please bring your own lock.
- Restrooms are located throughout the complex with access to sinks, private shower stalls and private toilets.
- Males and females are housed in separate bays.

SPACE CAMP California at Mountain View

The Habitat is located on site and comprised of modular units with bunk beds in an open-bay setting. Each sleep bay accommodates 38 trainees with a counselor's room located at one end of the sleep bay.

 Bed sheets and blanket, pillow and pillowcase, towels and washcloths are provided. Bring a beach towel for water activities.



Each trainee will have an assigned locker. Please bring your own lock.

- Restrooms are located in each Habitat with access to sinks, private shower stalls and private toilets.
- Males and females are housed in separate bays.

AVIATION CHALLENGE Atwater, California (at the former Castle Air Force Base)

When you train like a jet fighter, you might as well stay where the jet fighters stayed.

Trainees stay in refurbished BOQs (Bachelor Officer's Quarters). Similar to a hotel, each room's




entrance is off a main hallway. There are 24 counselor rooms, each housing two same gender counselors. Counselor rooms are located at the ends of each hallway.

- Bed sheets and blanket, pillow and pillowcase, towels and bar soap are provided. Bring a beach towel for water activities. Each trainee will have an assigned locker. Please bring your own lock.
- Each trainee suite shares a restroom with access to sinks, private shower stalls and private toilets.
- Males and females are housed in separate areas of the dorm.

SPACE CAMP Florida

Trainees stay in the Habitat, a four-story housing complex located next to the SPACE CAMP Training Center. Each sleep bay accommodates 24 trainees in bunk beds. A counselor's room is located at one end of the sleep bay.



- Bed sheets and blanket, pillow and pillowcase, towels and washcloths are provided. Bring a beach towel for water activities during June, July and August. Each trainee will have an assigned locker. Please bring your own lock.
- Each sleep bay has sinks, private shower stalls and private toilets.
- Campers are housed by gender in separate sleep bays.

WEALS

Breakfast, lunch and dinner are provided in a common dining area from the afternoon/evening of arrival up to graduation.

At each meal, we offer a variety of foods to appeal to different preferences. Snacks and soft drinks are also available at various sites within the facility at the trainee's expense.

We try to accommodate trainees with special dietary requirements. If the requirement exceeds our capabilities, trainees can bring their own food and/or pay the additional cost of meeting those needs.

Do not send food to camp with your child unless it is to accommodate special dietary needs.

We do require advance notice if your child will be bringing food for this reason – please call the camp you are attending (Refer to camp phone listings on page 32).

Sibling Discount

When more than one child from the same family with the same address attends any five-day program during the same session week, one child will attend at full tuition, and each additional child will receive a 10% discount. Sibling discounts are not available for Parent/Child or Pilot/Copilot programs and cannot be used with any other discount or special offer.

Gift Certificates

You may purchase a gift certificate for any camp program. When making your reservation, be sure to inform the agent that you'd like us to issue a gift certificate. Gift certificates will be mailed within five business days.

Transfer Requests

All session transfer requests must be received no later than two weeks prior to scheduled session start date. You may request one session transfer at no charge. Each additional transfer will cost \$25.

We reserve the right to cancel a session date if participation numbers are not adequate. You may select an alternative session date or you may request a full refund of tuition paid.

Waiting List

Summer and holiday sessions fill quickly. If your desired session date(s) is full at the time you register, you can be placed on our waiting list. **NOTE:** Wait list registration is available on our website or by calling our reservations staff. If a slot opens up, we will call you.

Scholarships

A limited number of full and partialtuition scholarships for Spring and Fall sessions are available to students currently attending fourth through twelfth grades. To be considered for a scholarship, students must submit a scholarship application form accompanied by a short essay on a topic designated by the scholarship office.

Because sessions fill quickly, you may wish to consider registering while pursuing a scholarship. Should you receive a scholarship, your tuition will be refunded.

You do not have to pre-register in order to apply for a scholarship.

We issue electronic tickets whenever possible — you will receive two copies of the itinerary/invoice along with the original passenger receipt.

We strongly recommend you confirm your airline reservations 7-14 days prior to your date of departure.

IMPORTANT

All airlines require Unaccompanied Minor (UM) service for children under 14. Fees vary by airline and are subject to change without notice. Your travel agency cannot make a UM reservation for you; however, they can notify the airline that you will be requesting this service. Round-trip UM fees are your responsibility and are payable to the airline at the ticket counter. SPACE CAMP and AVIATION CHALLENGE will not pay UM fees. Some airlines also offer a complimentary meet and assist program for children over 14. Check with your airline.

ARRIVAL AT CAMP

Trainees arriving via air are greeted at the airport by uniformed camp personnel with photo identification and transported by bus or van to SPACE CAMP or AVIATION CHALLENGE. Staff members collect airline tickets and re-confirm return flights.

Upon check-in at camp, all students are encouraged to call home to let parents/guardians know they have arrived safely.

Early Arrival/Late Departure Program

Not available for Adult or Parent/ Child Programs

If travel schedule requires arrival at any time the Saturday before camp starts or at any time the Saturday after camp ends, a planned and supervised program, including all meals and lodging, is available for an additional \$79 per day.

- Arrivals should be scheduled no earlier than 2 p.m. the day prior to session start date.
- Departures should be scheduled no later than noon the day after graduation.

MERCHANDISE

Optional flight suits and clothing are available for the camp programs. If you choose to order any clothing, your child will receive it while he is at camp. Refer to page 23 for details.

Spending Money

Whether or not you send your child with spending money is a personal decision. All meals are included in the tuition. Spending money comes in handy for snacks or drinks from commercial vending machines located throughout each facility, as well as for purchasing items in our gift shops.

Should you decide to send spending money, we strongly recommend all trainees attending the youth programs exchange their cash for "Space Traveler's Checks" (Shuttle Bucks in Alabama, Space Bucks in Florida and California, Bomber Bucks at AVIATION CHALLENGE in California).

U.S. SPACE CAMP and AVIATION CHALLENGE assume no liability for lost cash.

Space Traveler's Checks may be purchased with cash or check ONLY (payable to U.S. SPACE CAMP) and ONLY at registration. Trainees will be able to convert unused Space Traveler's Checks back to cash at the end of their camp session.

BOY SCOUT MERIT BADGES

Scouts attending SPACE CAMP, SPACE ACADEMY or AD-VANCED SPACE ACADEMY qualify for the Space Exploration merit badge and should bring a blue merit badge card to camp to turn in at check-in.

Scouts attending AVIATION CHALLENGE will complete all requirements for the Aviation and Wilderness Survival merit badges and should bring a blue merit badge card to camp to turn in at check-in.

AVIATION CHALLENGE Alabama also offers partial completion of the First-Aid and Fire Safety merit badges. Scouts attending AVIATION CHALLENGE in Alabama will receive a form letter indicating which requirements have been completed for each of these merit badges.



Camp Check-In

Check-in takes place on site at the camp you have selected on the first day of your child's session.

We strongly recommend that you send a copy of all completed forms with your child.

For registration times, please refer to pages 14-15 for SPACE CAMP and pages 21-22 for AVIATION CHALLENGE.

Visiting the Trainee

We understand that you will miss your child while he or she is attending our program. However, we discourage visits while camp is in session so that your child may have a true "away-from-home" experience.

We do encourage parents to attend graduation ceremonies, and, of course, will make special arrangements for visitation in case of family emergencies.

At registration, parents must designate who is authorized to visit or pick up the trainee; and proper identication is required at the time of visit or pickup.

Telephone Calls

Trainees cannot receive personal phone calls during their session unless it is an emergency. Your child will have the opportunity to call home in the evenings via collect call or calling card (schedule permitting). You may not hear from your child every day. Make sure he/she has phone numbers where family members can be reached at all times. Also make sure that he/she knows how to call collect or use a calling card.

Alabama and Florida facilities are TDD/TTY accessible for the hearing impaired.

Graduation

A formal graduation ceremony is held on site at the camp your child attends on the last day of the session. Family members are invited to attend.
