


NASA Visitor Center/Bus Tour

Rocket and Shuttle Park

Dr. Wernher von Braun and his rocket team fathered the technology that launched the American manned space program. Marvel at the technological legacy of the von Braun team in the fouracre Rocket Park. Stroll along the Saturn V, which is longer than a football field and is a National Historic Landmark, Stand under the nation's only full-scale, public shuttle display in Shuttle Park. It features the Pathfinder orbiter and external tanks and solid rocket boosters that were used for testing or actually flew on shuttle missions. Experience the 3-G's of a lift-off in the Centrifuge (must be 50 inches tall). Feel what it's like to walk on the moon on the Spacewalker and travel to a space station in the Shuttle to Tomorrow. Simulators close one hour before the rest of the Space Center.

Museum Floor

Find out about the power behind the Suttle Main Engine and see and hear about the Lunar Lander and Rover and the giant step to the moon. Learn the how and why of Space Suits and the details about the first U.S. space station Skylab.
